1. It is a mitzvah to see the letters of the Torah during Hagbah because we must see the letters to testify that this is the Torah Moshe gave us.

2. The person who does Hagbah gets the zechusim of all the aliyos before him.

3. Hagbah imparts this zechus because it completes the Torah reading.

4. The letters we look at during Hagbah teach us important lessons.

5. The letter Aleph consists of an upper Yud, a lower Yud, and a middle Vav.

6. Yud represents G-d and the words "Yisrael" and "Yehudi."

7. In the letter Aleph, the upper Yud represents G-d, the lower Yud represents the Jew, and the Vav connects them together like a rope.

8. The Alter Rebbe (Igeress HaTeshuvah): the neshamah is like a rope. One end originates in G-d Himself and the other end is found in the Jew's body.

9. Pulling one rope end drags the other rope end; doing a mitzvah below "pulls" on G-d Above.

10. We are always connected to G-d like husband and wife are always connected to each other.

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
