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1. We cannot fight terror while at the same time depending on oil and funding terror. If we stop depending on oil, we will stop funding terror.



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2. Why do evil governments control the world's oil, while good governments do not? Why did G-d give evil such power?

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3. G-d gives the Jewish People manna and Moses tells them not to leave any over for morning. Dasan and Aviram defy Moses and do not listen. Additional examples of Dasan and Aviram defying Moses:

- a) Dasan berating Moses when told not to hit Aviram.
- b) Informing on Moses to Pharaoh, causing Moses to flee.
- c) Criticizing Moses for making slavery harder.
- d) Inciting the Jews to replace Moses and Aaron with themselves at the Spies episode.
- e) Inciting Korach to rebel against Moses, as King David says.



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4. Tanya: G-d created universe with paralleling forces of good and evil in every detail. Examples of good/evil parallels:

- a. Isaac vs. Ishmael
- b. Jacob vs. Esau
- c. Moses and Aaron vs. Dasan and Aviram



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5. If evil didn't exist, there would be not free choice to choose good over evil.



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6. The reason choosing evil sometimes produces rewards and choosing good does not is so people could have free choice. That is why Moses was opposed by Dasan and Aviram—so the people could choose who to follow.

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7. The choice before the world today is whether to choose good, represented by America and Israel, or evil, represented by the opponents of America and Israel.



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8. Good is permanent, evil is temporary; this is why the Nazis and Communists failed; this is why we must not fear; good will ultimately triumph.



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
